- Clean up begins at 4:00. Please bring a large garbage bag and plan on taking a bag of trash home for disposal.

**WHAT TO BRING:** For safety purposes, wear blue jeans and sturdy shoes—no sandals and shorts please. Bring lawn chairs or blankets, **your own cooler with ice and drinks,** a large plastic garbage bag, plus the items assigned for your child's grade level. You may also want to bring bug spray, Frisbees, balls...the things that make a hayride fun. *No pets, please*.

An important reminder: The Annual HLS Hayride is fun time for the whole family. To ensure that it remains fun and safe, parents must be responsible for their children at all times. It is easy to get caught up in conversation and easy for our little ones to wander into dangerous situations. At the farm, surrounded by woods, rocky slopes, and plenty of activity, it is more important than ever that we keep a watchful eye on our young children. We are asking that a parent accompany children in grades 5 and under on the tractor-pulled hayrides and on all nature hikes. Thanks for your help! ALSO, for you city folk, remember that a genuine, crescent-moon-in-the-door outhouse is provided for your convenience...and that's all!

10<sup>th</sup> – Paper towels

11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> – Condiments

## Directions to the Lowe Farm

The Lowe farm is located about 45 minutes south of Louisville in Nelson County in the 6200 block of Springfield Rd.

Simply follow these directions and refer to attached map.

- Take 65 south from Louisville. Exit at Bardstown/Clermont exit approximately 20 miles south of Louisville.
- Turn left onto Hwy 245 towards Bardstown. Continue on Hwy 245 for about 19 miles **until the road dead ends**. (You will pass the Super Wal-mart on your right.)
- When the road ends, turn left onto Hwy 150 towards Springfield. NOTE: This is the 2<sup>nd</sup> access to Hwy 150. You will have passed the first one approximately 3 miles earlier that says Hwy 31E and Hwy 150.
- Continue on Hwy 150 for 4 miles. Turn right onto the gravel road with the HLS sign. Follow the gravel road to the parking area.
