The Grid Method

Artists sometimes use a pair of grids when recreating a work of art (particularly to reduce or enlarge it). One grid divides the original into squares and the second breaks a blank canvas into the same number of squares which are then filled to match the original.

The HLS third graders used a grid to copy a famous dog (one from the children's book *Go Dog Go* by P.D. Eastman) and then added their own imaginative background.
