

25-26 Crescent Hill Grades 7-8

Organization is one of the biggest challenges of 7th and 8th grade. You have multiple teachers who each have slightly different expectations for binders, assignments, and notes. You will need to take responsibility for yourself: take good notes, write down your assignments, and work hard!

If students misplace or run out of supplies, they are responsible for bringing replacements.

30	Dividers (Teachers will instruct in which binder they belong.)
1	Pencil pouch or box for holding all pencils, pens, and highlighters
1	Red pen
12	Pencils and erasers

12	Thin Black Dry erase markers
1	Dry erase eraser
2	Loose leaf 4x4 graph paper packages
3	Loose leaf college ruled notebook paper packages
1	Composition notebook
1	Clear plastic ruler with metric scale
1	Protractor
1	Scientific calculator (similar to TI-30XIIS)*
2	Kleenex boxes (bring to office at Student Orientation)
1	Clipboard (7th only)

*Graphing is introduced in 8th grade, but graphing calculators are not required until high school. Scientific (non-graphing) calculators like the TI-30XIIS are inexpensive, but families often prefer to buy one calculator once, so they purchase a graphing calculator that is intended to be used throughout high school. Graphing calculators like TI-83 or 84 are acceptable, but calculators are only allowed during math class or for use in completing homework. TI-89 or 92 are not allowed on standardized testing in high school.
